How the kids have benefited

Our PTA has allowed families to spend social time together as a community, outside of school day. With fun and memorable events; Summer Fete (Morris Dancers, Reptiles, Fire Engine), Bonfire & Firework night, September Social, end of term playground stay and play.

The funds have been used to create enrichment opportunities and activities, such as the Christmas Bauble decorating and First Aid workshop. Their learning continues to be enhanced through the purchasing of resources and equipment, most notably this year a significant boost to the schools technology and music provision. The PTA funds supplemented some of the costs of installing the 'cabin' as an additional learning space. There have also been treats along the way; Easter eggs, Christmas gifts from Santa, ice creams at the pantomime. Furthermore, thanks to parent effort the PTA has brought special dates in the school calendar to life; visits from the Easter Bunny, Pudsey Bear and Father Christmas.

Lessons learnt?

There is little appetite for certain events- Not enough interest in the idea of a PTA Quiz Night to make the effort viable. Subsequently it did not go ahead. Will see next week if the Christmas Wreath Workshop has been able to drum up more enthusiasm...? The last day of term in May, saw a family stay and play session on the playground with ice creams and homemade lemonade, this was a lovely way the end the term from a school community perspective. The last day of the school year, Leaver's Picnic, unfortunately was unable to go ahead due to extreme temperatures.
